## Public Use of Governor Ross Mansion Grounds

## Adopted June 12, 2024

The Governor Ross Mansion and its grounds are private property. The Seaford Historical Society welcomes you to enjoy our sites while adhering to the following regulations:

Photographers and Artists (Amateur and Professional), see our **Photographer and Artist Policy**.

The Governor Ross Mansion grounds are closed dusk-to-dawn and during private events.

Use of the Ross Mansion grounds is at your own risk.

Do not disturb or alter the property in any way.

Do not litter. You are responsible for removing your trash from the premises.

Do not climb on the trees, buildings, walls, railings, or furnishings.

Do not disturb others who are enjoying the grounds.

No loud music, shouting, or other disturbances. Seaford Historical Society staff have sole discretion in determining what constitutes a disturbance.

You may not have a tent, cooking equipment, or other apparatus that can cause damage to the grounds or buildings. Seaford Historical Society staff have sole discretion in determining what is permitted. If you have questions, please contact our office.

You may have blankets, picnic baskets, portable chairs, handheld cameras and cell phones. (See also **Photographer and Artist Policy**)

Leashed pets permitted, except in the Formal Garden. You are responsible for removing your pet's waste and for all damage or injury caused by your pet.

Do not feed or disturb wildlife.

The Seaford Historical Society is not responsible for personal property that is lost, damaged, or stolen.

Artifacts discovered on Ross Mansion grounds are the property of the Seaford Historical Society.

Park in designated areas only. Do not block driveways.

All City of Seaford ordinances apply.

You must follow directions from Historical Society staff.

Stay on the designated paths.

No food or drink.

No pets, except registered assistance animals
